The first meeting and election of Monroe Township officers was held in 1818. David Niles chaired the meeting with Ezekiel Colby and Elijah Peck serving as the judges of election. Those elected were David Niles, Harvey Dean and Stephen Webb, trustees; Martin Kellogg, clerk; Amos Kellogg, treasurer; Asa Brown and Peter Peck, Overseers of the Poor; Perry G. Gardner and Isaac Bennett, fence viewers. Township officers in 1819 were John Bushnell, Caleb Blodgett and Benjamin Abbott, trustees; Peter Peck, clerk; Stephen Webb, treasurer; Wm. Ensign and David Niles, justices of the peace; and Harvey Dean, lister.
