

Sudden Death of David F. Jones

David F. Jones, a very well-known resident of the town of Bridgewater, near Scrabble Hill, died at his home at 6 o'clock Monday morning as the result of an accident the night before. He was working on his hay mow and in jumping from the top of it struck a door. He was able to walk about a quarter of a mile to his home, but was then obliged to go to bed. A physician was summoned, but Mr. Jones failed rapidly until the end. A ruptured blood vessel was the cause of death. The news of his sudden death caused general regret in this place, where he was often seen, and was held in high esteem.

Mr. Jones was born in North Wales about sixty-three years ago and came to this country at an early age. He at once located near Bridgewater, where he had ever since made his home. He was engaged in farming and was quite successful, owning a large piece of property. Besides his wife he leaves six children: Mrs. W. R. Pugh of Waterville, Mrs. George Morris of Utica, Mrs. Charles B. Clark, David F. Jones, Jr., Charles T. Jones, and R. Jones of Bridgewater. The funeral was held from his home Wednesday afternoon and interment was made in Waterville.
